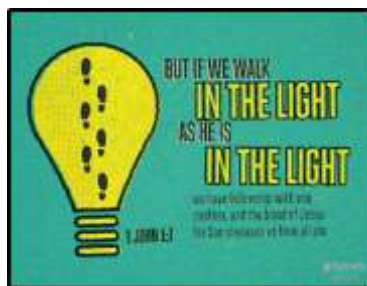
## A Most Wonderful Time of the Year

Daylight Savings lies in my top five favorite days each year. This year, it falls on Sunday, **March 11, and it can't get here soon enough.** I absolutely *love* getting that extra hour of daylight back in the evening, even it means sacrificing a bit of sleep one night (unless, of course, you watch one less episode on Netflix and go to bed an hour earlier on March 10). As a student, I found myself to be sharper doing evening homework after Daylight Savings because the sun was up later. Now, as an adult, I look forward to grilling my supper in twilight as opposed to flashlight. The extra evening daylight affects my mood, my performance, and my choice of activities.

No wonder, then, Jesus used that description of himself. Jesus said, **"I am the light of the world" (John 8:12).** His disciple John, who heard Jesus say that, echoed that thought in one of his letters when he wrote, **"If we walk in the light as [God] is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin" (1**

John 1:7). More than we need an hour of extra light in the evening, you and I need the spiritual light Jesus provides. Without it – without *him* – the darkness negatively affects us both now and for eternity. Without Jesus, we live in a long night of spiritual darkness where we are bitter with God and with others. Without Jesus, we live in a long night of spiritual darkness where we are lethargic and anything but alert. Without Jesus, we live in a long night of spiritual darkness where we choose thoughts, words, and actions that put more and more distance between us and God. Without Jesus, we are destined to an eternal night of darkness in hell.

Praise God, though, that his Son Jesus breaks that darkness with his light of life! And you do not have to do a thing. **You don't even need to something** as small as setting a spiritual clock an hour ahead. Instead, Jesus shines in our lives with a pure and **beaming light. It's not a life that we** need to fear, as if Jesus shines it to expose our darkest thoughts and deeds. No! He

shines his light to show us his cross. This Lent we're watching Jesus suffer for us in the darkness of Gethsemane's Garden, in the shadows of the temple trial, and in the miraculous darkness that covered the earth on Good Friday. But Jesus wants you to see all of Lent with the clear light of the gospel: this is done for you to "purify [you] from all sin" and to rescue you from your spiritual darkness! And, not far off in the distance, we see a light coming from somewhere – from a grave. But more about that next month.

For now, marvel at the fellowship you have with God in the light Jesus gives you. Marvel also at the fellowship you have with all the other Christians who walk in this light as you do, especially your friends here at Living Water. Fellowship remains a big part of what we do as a congregation. When we're having dark times in our lives, we want to be reminded and strengthened of our fellowship with God through Jesus, but we also want to strengthen the fellowship we have with one another. It's why we have snacks and beverages after every Sunday service. Hang a right out of the sanctuary to snack and chat with someone next Sunday! Come and have a meal with fellow Christians before our midweek Lenten services. There is no better way to enjoy the light than by experiencing it with others. Just make sure you set your clocks ahead on March 10 so you're not late for that fellowship on March 11.

May Jesus' forgiveness light your way this month and this Lent! Serving our Savior with you,

## Loneliness - TEEN DEVOTION

*Two are better than one, because they have a good return for their labor: If either of them falls down, one can help the other up. But pity anyone who falls and has no one to help them up. Also, if two lie down together, they will keep warm. But how can one keep warm alone? Though one may be overpowered, two can defend themselves. A cord of three strands is not quickly broken.*

Ecclesiastes 4:9-12

Loneliness is not fun. In fact, it's awful. It's one of the worst feelings anyone can experience. You have probably felt lonely at some time in your life. Being alone itself is no fun. Yet suffering alone through trouble, hardship, break ups, broken friendships, temptations, and anything in between feels even worse. In fact, it can be bad for us.

The devil comes after you with the temptation that church isn't important and you don't need to go. He wants you to think that there is no one who cares for you. He wants you to believe that you are absolutely alone. The devil also tricks you into thinking that you can handle life alone. He wants you to think you can handle temptation alone. He tricks you to think you can walk through life alone so that you might even purposely isolate yourself.

But here's the truth: You're not alone. In fact, it's good for us to seek out Christian friends to help us face life and the trouble it brings.

King Solomon wrote the passage that we focus on today. He was a man familiar with popularity and admirers. He was the wealthiest king of Israel. He was the wisest person to ever live. Foreign kings and queens sought his advice. If anyone had it all, it was him.

But Solomon was also a man familiar with great loneliness and sorrow. Read the book of Ecclesiastes. Despite all his wisdom, riches, power, and influence, he felt alone. He realized the importance of community, the importance of being together. You can read it in these words. One person is overpowered easily. Two people can actually defend themselves. Two people will help each other out. Two people can keep warm. But three? That's even better. A cord of three strands is not easily broken.

Solomon is making the point that community is key in your life. The most important community is your Christian community. This Christian community is most easily and readily found at church. When believers come together, they can endure great hardships. They can survive great atrocities. They can withstand the worst things imaginable. They can face temptation.

Why? Not just because they have each other, but because they have their God and Savior Jesus. **This Christian community has God's Word.**

You have a community of fellow believers who suffer through many of the same things that you do. They face the same temptations and struggle with the constant battle against sin. This community gathers at your church and is there to help you. You are the two that defend each other, who keep each other warm. This community warns us about sin, false teachers, and the devil. This community comforts us with the truth that God is with us, God forgives, and Jesus has already won the war by rising from the dead.

The people aren't even the most important part of this community. Solomon talks about a cord of three strands. The third strand is the God who protects you, forgives you, provides for you, and carries you in times of weakness. God is the one who is your strength and comfort.

Prayer: Dear Lord, help me see the blessings of your Church and its community. Help me rely on you and your grace, strength, and mercy to get through hardships and trials. Amen.

"Until now you have not asked for anything in my name. Ask and you will receive, and your joy will be complete." John 16:24

- Pray for leaders who serve the Lord Jesus before they serve themselves.  
Pray for the future of America that we may be led by God-fearing leaders and have citizens who love, honor, and respect God and his Word in the home, schools, workplace and all of government.
- Pray for children that they honor their parents and those in authority. Pray for parents not to exasperate their children but to love them and raise them in Christian homes and by Christian examples.

- Pray for those in financial trouble asking God to grant them his peace and wisdom to use all his gifts to his glory. Pray that they may realize how temporary worldly wealth is and grasp how wide **and deep God's love is**.
- Pray for those who are struggling with health issues, loss of a loved one, and any other family issues. Pray that they have the strength to persevere and know the love of God.
