Along the line, some of you may be celebrating the end of the school year, if you're connected to a school which ends that early. After a long winter, all of a sudden we have some special days popping up on our calendars that give us joy and a reason to be glad!

Can I throw three other dates in May that can give you – and our entire congregation – reasons to rejoice and be glad?

Thursday, May 10 – Exactly forty days after we celebrated Easter, the


Christian Church around the world rejoices in Jesus' ascension. Since our Savior completed his mission to save us from our sins, he went back

Sunday, May 20 – Ten days after celebrating ascension, we have two reasons to celebrate! First, it's Pentecost. Fifty days after Jesus rose from the dead, he sent the Holy Spirit, just as he promised, to his believers in a miraculous show of audio visuals – sound like a rushing wind and something that seemed like tongues of fire over people's heads. We have that same Holy Spirit living and working among us whenever we hear or read the Bible.

Finally, **Sunday May 27** – On the church calendar, the Sunday after Pentecost is Trinity Sunday. Our brains hurt as we contemplate and study the mystery that our God is triune – three distinct persons in one deity. It doesn't make sense logically, and we'll never be able to fully understand it this side of heaven. But we believe this truth, and our faith rejoices that this Triune God is the God who created us, who redeemed us from sin, and who keeps us in the true saving faith. With a God like that, how could we not be glad each and every day?

And that's the psalmist's whole point in 118:24. Those who trust in the triune God for their free and full salvation – they have reason to rejoice and be glad each and every day. Each and every day is a gift from God, and we get to live in the joy and gladness of forgiveness of sins. Sometimes, we're extra joyful, like when we're celebrating everything our mothers have done and are doing for us. Or when we watch young adults publicly promise to remain faithful to their ascended Lord until death. Or when we're reminded that the Holy Spirit is our personal counselor and guide, given to us directly by the Father and by Jesus. Or when we gratefully remember the sacrifices so many men and women made to give us the freedom to worship that Triune God.

So, whatever special days you're celebrating this May, always remember that for Christians, each and every day is a reason to rejoice and be glad. Each day – not just American holidays or church holy days – is a gift that God that he made for you. A day made for you to remember that you're his forgiven child and to live out that joy among others.

The present church was designed by Armand Koch, who also designed Milwaukee's City Hall. It was built in German Gothic Revival style with gorgeous stained glass and ornate woodwork and was dedicated in 1901. We were all impressed by the unusual altar with a baldachin, or canopy, which makes the pastor's sermon sound louder. The church now has more than 1200 members and is a vital part of downtown Milwaukee. After our tour of Grace, we went to lunch at Mader's German Restaurant. We will also be collecting diapers (size 4 and 5) and baby wipes for Tomorrow's Choice Family Resource Center located in Waukesha. This WELS organization provides free resources such as diapers, wipes and children's clothing for families in need. They also share God's Word with their clients as well as a place that shows them unconditional love. The majority of the clients are immigrants from other countries who lack daily supplies needed to provide for their families. Please consider donating diapers, wipes or new/gently used children's clothing up to size 14-16. All items can be placed in the bassinet in the narthex.

Both will begin on Mother's Day, Sunday, May 13 and run until Father's Day, Sunday, June 17.

Every day [all the believers] continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts. – **Acts 2:46**

Don't forget your team

It's game day. You know what you have to do, so you get out on the court or field to face your opponents. Then you realize something's wrong. You're all by yourself. The other team is there, looming over you like a dark storm cloud from the other end of the field. However, not one of your teammates can be seen. Not on the court. Not on the bench. Nowhere. You have no one on your side.

Do you ever feel like that is your spiritual situation? Maybe you feel like the only Christian at your school facing the whole science department that teaches evolution as truth. Maybe you're the only one at your job who doesn't want to take a longer break than allowed. Maybe you're the only one at a party who doesn't want to drink because you're underage.

In those situations, you may feel alone and unable to handle the pressure. You know his promise to always be with you, yet the present situation makes you question God's presence.

That's one of the reasons God surrounds us with the church and puts other Christians in our lives. God does not want us to be alone. He wants us to be together.

God equips your Christian friends to help you through all kinds of life's problems, earthly or spiritual. Whether you have questions about the Bible or about your homework, whether you're trying to pick a college or what to wear to school tomorrow, Christian friends can help because they (like you) know where to find answers to life's critical questions. Christian brothers and sisters can remind you of God's promises and give encouragement, comfort, or even correction from God's Word. And not only do you get to enjoy these benefits, but to share them! God calls you to be that encouraging, supportive Christian friend to others too.

Most importantly, when you do crack under the pressure and give in to sin, your Christian friends are there to point you to Jesus. Your Christian friends are there to show and give you Jesus's forgiveness. His perfect life and innocent death paid the penalty for all your sins. That's the message you need to hear most of all. That's also the message your friends need to hear from you most of all.

Do you have Christian friends? Thank God for them! Surround yourself with them. Then be one for them!

Prayer: Dear Lord, thank you so much for blessing me with Christian friends so we can encourage each other to stay close to you. Forgive me for the times I haven't been the friend you want me to be. Thank you for being the perfect friend. Amen.
