How Do You Explain Our Church's Name?

Like any good Midwesterner, I recently took a vacation by going "up north." Midwesterners must take advantage of the warm weather while it's here, and it's a Midwest pastime to take advantage of the summer weather by going to, in, by, or on water. Which is exactly what I spent a lot of time doing on vacation. I dove into an inland lake off a pontoon. I picked my jaw off a boat deck as I rode along the majestic Pictured Rocks National Lakeshore along Lake Superior. I gawked at the open water of Green Bay as I

drove along Highway 41. I stood next to Tahquamenon Falls, the second largest waterfall this side of the mighty Mississippi.

Standing next to that fifty foot waterfall made me think about our church's name, Living Water. Why? That waterfall is both a source of life and a sign of life. Those falls were a source of life to many in Michigan's Upper Peninsula. They helped loggers transport timber so they could collect paychecks. But the Tahquamenon Falls are also a sign of life. Hearing the water's roar and seeing the gallons rush over the edge let you know that this is not some stagnant, nasty, dead creek. It's alive and working!

A source of life and a sign of life. Those two concepts are behind our name, Living Water. It's not just an homage to the many lakes and

> rivers around here. It's a reminder of important passages from our Savior's mouth. He is the one who gives us eternal life. We receive eternal life as God creates and strengthens faith through his Word, especially the gospel, the good news about Jesus. As Jesus himself told the woman at the well, "The water I give him

will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life" (John 3:14). Jesus and his Word are the source of eternal life.

But Jesus and his Word also create signs of life in us that flow out of us. As Christians, we dare never become stagnant pools of disgusting sludge and sin. Instead, we actively live out our trust in God and our hope for eternal life! Jesus also declared, "Whoever believes in me, as Scripture has said, streams of living water will flow from within him" (John 7:38). Like a rushing river cresting into a massive waterfall, our faith is always producing more and more good works. These good works constantly flow out of our thanks for Jesus and his forgiveness. Jesus and his Word produce signs of spiritual life within us.

I hope you are able to get away to your favorite lake or river this summer and enjoy God's gift of creation. More importantly, I pray that you and I are always making time to be refreshed and renewed by God's gift of living water – Jesus Christ our Savior and the Word he has given to us.

Financial Blessings

We are just past half way through 2018. Looking at the first 26 weeks of the year, we have average weekly offerings of \$4,519. Looking at our budget, our weekly needs are the same, \$4,519. So, we are right on track for meeting our budget. If we compare 2018 to the first 26 weeks of 2017, we see the average weekly offerings were \$4,246. That puts us ahead of last year's giving by \$273 per week or \$7,098 for the 26 week period. Thanks be to God for his continued blessings!

Does Obedience Lead to Blessing? TEEN DEVOTION

I am not saying this because I am in need, for I have learned to be content whatever the circumstances. I know what it is to be in need, and I know what it is to have plenty. I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want. I can do all this through him who gives me strength.

– Philippians 4:11-13

This month we're looking at a statement that people claim comes from the Bible: 'Obedience always leads to blessing.' It sounds good and can even be understood in a true, biblical sense. Blessed are they who hear the Word of God and obey it," Jesus said (Luke 11:28). God gives us his commands because he wants to bless us. He wants us to live his way in this world. That is the best way to live. It is a blessing to live God's way in this world.

But what if I do obey God, and it doesn't turn out well? What if I obey God and honor his will, but I lose my job because of it? What if I'm living a life of obedience and get made fun of? Or I get cancer? What if I'm doing all the right things, but my life is one hardship after another?

This saying falls apart when obedience doesn't lead to blessing, but instead leads to hardship.

The apostle Paul grappled with this in his life. After his conversion to Christianity, Paul devoted himself to doing God's will. Even then, he had to admit, "There is no one righteous, not even one" (Romans 3:10). Sometimes his life went well. He was well fed and had plenty of God's gifts to enjoy. But there were other times when his life did not work out so well. He was hungry. In fact, Paul wrote this letter to the Philippians from a table in his jail cell. Things didn't turn out well at all.

But Paul gives us the secret to a blessed life. He tells us how to be contented and happy whether the circumstances of life are good or not, whether they are pleasant or unpleasant. "I can do all this through him who gives me strength." Paul knew that the secret to a blessed life was found in the gifts that Jesus gives, in the rule that Jesus exerts, in the protection that Jesus offers.

This is where we find contentment and blessing. Jesus gives us gifts every day, exactly what he wants us to have. He never shorts us (even if we think sometimes that he does). Jesus always gives us the right gifts and the right amount of them because he is good. Jesus rules over our lives. Yes, he rules over the good times and the hard times. He rules over them for our eternal good, because he wants us to spend an eternity with him. He protects us from danger, especially danger to our souls.

Sometimes there are good times. Other times there are hard times. But our Father rules over both the happy and the sad times. He rules over our lives for our good and promises to give good and perfect gifts to us. He does it all, not because we obeyed, but simply because he is our good and gracious Father in heaven.

Prayer: Dear Father in heaven, thank you for ruling over my life for my eternal good and not for my harm. Help me to understand that you always bless me and do good for me, even if it means that hard things enter my life. You are good at all times, O God. Your will is always good for me. Amen.
