## [The devil] left [Jesus] until an opportune time (Luke 4:13 NIV)

For me, Lent comes at a pretty opportune time this year. The start of Lent (Ash Wednesday) varies from year to year. Why? Ash Wednesday depends on the date for Easter, and that depends on the moon. Easter is always the first Sunday after the first full moon after the spring equinox. With the way the moon works out, this year's Ash Wednesday (March 6) is one of the latest dates it can be. Which means I had extra time this year between Christmas and Lent to do worship planning. It was nice.

But life doesn't always come at you at your opportune time. The year you expect a tax refund is the year you have to pay extra. The time you need a letup in classes you get an extra assignment. The winter you think should be winding down has some more snow and cold in store.

Satan works in a similar way. He tries to catch you off guard and find you at your inopportune time, which just so happens to be his opportune time – the opportune time for him to get you to



turn your back on God and fall for his lies. During the season Christians of Lent, are aware this especially of struggle between Satan and us sinner-saints. So much so, that Christians some give something up during Lent in order to draw more attention

to this intense struggle. As they struggle without the earthly thing they gave up, it's a reminder that they must struggle all the more against Satan and the spiritual things he wants us to give up.

But Satan is good – no, he's great – at finding us at our inopportune times, which are, of course, his opportune times. He comes to us when we're tired, hungry, lonely, afraid, sad, or you name it. He comes with lies that sound enticing. He comes with twists on the truth that leave us confused. And though our spirit may be willing to do battle, our sinful nature and flesh is weak. So, instead of making Satan feel like an unwelcome guest and making him leave, we invite him to stick around for a while.

What a comfort, then, to watch what our Savior does in the first Sunday of our Lenten journey! The appointed Gospel reading for the first Sunday in Lent comes from Luke 4:1-13. There, Jesus not once, not twice, but three times beats Satan at his own game! Three times Jesus, our champion of salvation, defeats the devil and his temptation. And it's not even close. Satan uses different temptations and tactics, but Jesus remains in control every time. Finally, Satan got the hint and turned around, a defeated spirit against the undefeated Son of God.

Where's the comfort for you in this? Jesus credits you with his perfection. Not just against those three temptations but with his entire perfect life. Through faith and trust in Jesus, God has given you credit for living a life a perfect life, the life Jesus lived for you! And there's another comfort in Luke 4:1-13. Jesus shows you how to beat temptation: by using what's written in God's Word to expose the devil's lies. For every devilish deception, Jesus had a quick counter from the Word of truth. Which means that for every temptation Satan brings to you, you can draw the sword of the Word and slice right through it.

And that's a big part of why we have so many extra worship opportunities during Lent: to see Christ be a champion for us and to be equipped to better stand against Satan's temptations. We know Satan will be coming. We know he'll find us at our inopportune times. But we also know whom he cannot defeat: Jesus our Savior. We know what he has no answer for: what is written true Word of God. Through faith, you have access to both. Trust in the former. Use the latter. And watch Satan be forced to leave, just as he did in the desert. God bless the beginning of your Lenten journey to Christ's cross!

#### Love & Marriage TEEN DEVOTION

Now as the church submits to Christ, so also wives should submit to their husbands in everything. Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her. —Ephesians 5:24-25 (NIV)

Is marriage a good or bad thing? More important is that it be a God thing. In the beginning of the world, God instituted marriage to be a safe place for husbands and wives to enjoy each other intimately and to provide a healthy and secure environment for children to grow up and be loved.

The further we get from Creation, the easier it is to forget God's good design. The apostle Paul reminds us of that design in the book of Ephesians and uses God's love for his church to describe it.

Wives are to submit—to put themselves under the authority and guidance of their husbands just like the church puts itself under the authority and guidance of Jesus. Husbands are to love their wives sacrificially, just like Jesus did when he died on the cross for his church.

Let's be clear: it would be absolutely incorrect to say this passage makes husbands more important and wives merely side-kicks in marriage. If that's what you're thinking, repent of it!

"The Lord God said, it was NOT good for man to be alone" (Genesis 2:18). It was essential that a woman be brought to Adam to be a part of his life. She would be someone that he could love and protect from his position as husband.

Maybe this illustration will help: Picture ballroom dancers. The man leads. The woman follows. But they both need each other for it to be a dance. He gives strength and direction. She provides grace and beauty. The beautiful dance doesn't stay beautiful. You'll step on each other's toes and fall many times—sometimes hard and it will hurt—but in Christ there is forgiveness as we strive to sacrifice and submit.

What a breathtakingly beautiful image of the interdependent dance God intends between a husband and wife! It's loving and leading. It's being loved and protected—just as Christ loved and led us by humbly submitting himself to death on a cross. He gave it all for his bride, the Church, of which you and I are a part. To be loved, protected, and guided ... it makes us so happy! Our dependence on Christ not only makes possible, but BEAUTIFUL, the interdependence of husbands and wives. What love! What beauty! Christ makes marriage a beautiful thing!

Prayer: Jesus, marriage is a good thing because it's a God thing. If it's your will to give me a spouse one day, help me to be the best husband or wife that I can possibly be! Amen.
