Of First Importance

Quick: what are the most important things you want to do over the next three weeks?

Would that be an easier question to answer four months ago? If you were asked that in early December, you might more easily rattle off a todo list. Finish Christmas decorations. Buy and wrap presents. Travel to see family and friends. And, of course, go with your family to a special Christmas worship service. By the time you're three weeks out from Christmas Day, you got a lot planned out. December 25 is one of the most important days of the year, and people plan for it.

We're now three weeks away from Easter Sunday. Does your to-do list reflect the importance of this special day? Not that advocating ľm for the craziness of December to make its way into early spring - the grocery runs, traveling

multiple parties, etc. But I hope that what happens on April 18, 19, and 21 are of "first importance" to you just as Christmas was.

In one of his letters, Paul saves the most important topic of Christianity for last. At the end of 1 Corinthians, fifty-eight verses are dedicated to the most important truth of the Christian faith - truths that are about to be celebrated in three weeks. Paul wrote, "For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas (Peter), and then to the Twelve" (1 Corinthians 15:3-5). Christ's death and resurrection are of "first importance" to Christians.

But in early spring, as your brackets get busted, as the Brewers open up, as the Bucks push to the playoffs, as the grilling season starts, as the kids have more field trips, and as the outside play dates pile up, we can so easily give these things more importance than the core truths of Christ's death and resurrection. Without the cultural pressure to buy presents or the benefit of paid holidays, Christ's death and resurrection can find itself in second, third, or even fourth importance in our lives.

But when stuff starts to go haywire in your life, what are the things that rise to the top as most important? Are they not the truths of Holy Week? The forgiveness of sins your Savior gives you in the Lord's Supper on Maundy Thursday allows you to go about your week guilt-free and peaceful. The punishment of hell the Son of God endured on the cross when his Father forsook him, means you don't have to look over your shoulder, expecting God to strike you down for your sins. The empty tomb on Easter Sunday assures that you yourself will be raised one day with a glorious body. Christ's resurrection gives you the joy of knowing you will see your Christian loved ones again in heaven.

It would be an understatement to say all that is important. It's not just important. It's "of first importance" because of the way it changes things. It changes the way we get up in the morning. It changes the way we go about our struggles. In fact, it's so important, it changes the way we schedule out our weeks ahead. Even though we've heard those truths before, we block out time to hear them again, as many as four times within about a sixty-four hour period, starting at 6:30 p.m. on April 18. As we pass the halfway point of Lent and round the corner to Easter, we eagerly await to receive again the core truths passed on throughout the centuries: "that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures."

That's of first importance for each of us every day.

I AM the Living Water TEEN DEVOTION

Jesus answered, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, but whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life." -John 4:13-14 (NIV)

When your body gets thirsty, it starts quietly but then begins to shout, "Warning! We are lacking what we need to live." It normally starts with a dry mouth or a dusty throat, but if the lack of hydration gets worse, the warning signs get stronger. The skin gets dry. The heart rate goes up. Eventually you might faint. All of these symptoms drive a person to look for relief. People are willing to do whatever it takes, even walk miles, just to find some water to relieve their thirst.

The same thing happens spiritually. We will often do just about anything to find relief. Some find relief in the satisfaction they get playing video games. Some find satisfaction in success with grades, sports, or work. Some find satisfaction in being a perfectionist.

Others find relief in the abuse of substances that give them an escape. Still others find satisfaction in feeling loved in a relationship, even if it means they find that in pornography or a damaging relationship. Like drinking salt water, all of these may give temporary relief from spiritual thirst but end up leaving a person thirstier than before. None of these things can give relief or satisfaction.

Instead, true relief and satisfaction for spiritual thirst comes from the one who gives real and perfect relief. Jesus says, "Whoever drinks that water I give them will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life."

When your spirit is lacking, go to the one who gives you relief. When you need to feel valued, go to the one who gives you value and self-worth. Your Savior values you so much, he gave his life for you.

When you seek perfection, go to the one who has made you perfect. Your Savior Jesus lived a perfect life and gives you credit for his life.

When you need to feel success, go to the one who has taken all of your failures away. Go to the one who gives you relief that overflows, like looking for a sip and instead getting a fountain. Go to the one who will give you perfect and eternal relief in heaven.

Prayer: Dear God, there have been times I sought personal escape from my problems through temporary ways that leave me thirsting for more in life. Thank you for offering to be the perfect relief my parched soul needs. Now quench me with your promises to never leave me or forsake me—today, tomorrow and forever. May the water of your Word always flow into my heart. Amen.

Council Corner

In an effort to be transparent about topics being discussed at the council meetings each month, we will be sharing some highlights and notes from the month's council meeting in the monthly newsletter. The council encourages members to ask questions and offer insight into any of the topics being discussed.

- Site Plan / Ministry Plan WELS has produced resource material to assist congregations in preparing a ministry plan. Over the next few meetings, council will take a deep dive into this material and begin by reviewing the current mission statement, and then expand out to align the various activities and groups into one cohesive ministry plan.
- **Outreach Mailing** Approximately 3,000 homes will receive a postcard invitation to Easter worship. The area is approximately half
